



**Senator Blanche Lincoln Visits Russell Compressor Station**

In early August, United States Senator Blanche Lincoln visited the Russell Compressor Station in Bald Knob, Arkansas to view construction of the facility. The station will provide the necessary pressure to move the gas along the pipeline route.

The compressor station, which uses seven engines to pressurize natural gas, will total 72,000 horsepower to keep natural gas flowing through the pipeline once it is in service. The compressor engines are each equipped with state of the art pollution control devices to minimize emissions.

Construction on the pipeline is well underway and is estimated to produce more than 2,000 jobs during the peak construction this year. In addition, the Russell Compressor Station is expected to produce several long term jobs for the operation of the facility.

**FEP Construction Advances**

Construction on the nearly 185-mile Fayetteville Express Pipeline continues to progress across Arkansas and Mississippi. Construction work on the four construction spreads began in March and crews have made steady progress since then.

Welding of the 42" steel pipe is nearly complete across the route and crews have lowered the pipe into the ground and backfilled in some areas.

Interim service from the SWN-Tiger receipt point to the NGPL delivery point in White County, AR is anticipated to be October 2010.

Additional natural gas receipt and delivery points are anticipated to come online throughout the fourth quarter of 2010, with full in-service anticipated by the end of 2010.
